Wine bottle sizes

Most wines come in the bottle size of 750ml. However, there are also other sizes where many of them have a specific name.

A 1.5L bottle is called a magnum. 3L bottle is a Jeroboam. 6L bottle is called Methuselah.

Going bigger, it is rare to see a Salmanazar (9L) and Balthazar (12L), let alone to lift a Nebuchadnezzar (15L) or Solomon (18L).
